

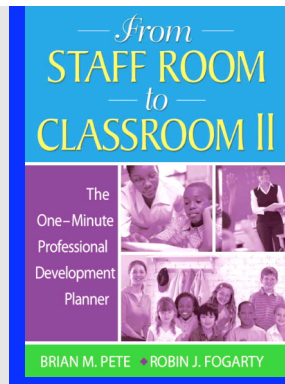

Coaching for Transfer-One Day Overview

The initial coaching training addresses three areas of the coaching for transfer concept: defining the coaching role; developing a repertoire of strategies for academic coaches, and looking at transfer theory. As the role of coach is unpacked, participants experience classroom coaching practices (modeling and observational skills), reflective practices (journaling, video analyses, and metacognitive questioning strategies), and collaborative models (peer coaching and transfer strategies). From metacognitive questions that guide reflective practice, to understandings about the various levels of transfer, to tools to enhance the coaching conference, participants leave with practical strategies for immediate use in the work setting.
